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


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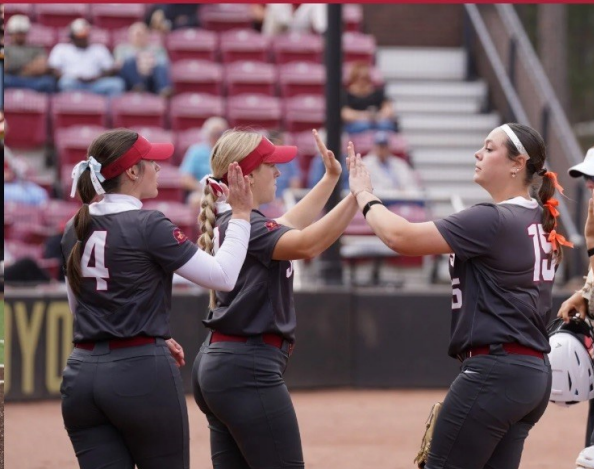
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FAST-PITCH SOFTBALL HISTORY

- 2002** Game 1: North 3, South 2; GAME 2: South 4, North 0 - The first annual MAC fast-pitch All Star games played at Hinds Community College in Raymond featured a split between the squads and outstanding pitching performances from the North's Katherine Sinele of Madison Central and the South's Emily Laird of South Jones. In game one, the North held on to an early 3-0 lead and halted the South's late rally to win 3-2. Sinele went the distance on the mound to record the win and was a star at the plate as she went 2 for 3 and knocked in 2 runs. She game up all 5 hits and the 2 runs scored by the South while walking 4 and striking out 4. Sinele was also helped out by North leftfielder Stacy McCommon of Amory who started double plays in the 5th and 6th innings. McCommon made the defensive play of the day by doubling up Sissy Waldrup of South Jones on a one bounce throw to home. Harrison Central's Dawn Harrison took the loss for the South as she worked 3 innings, giving up 2 hits, 1 run, and recording 2 strikeouts. The South evened up the series by taking game two in shutout fashion 4-0. Emily Laird of South Jones picked up the win by going the distance and pitching a one hitter. On the day, Laird worked 9 innings and gave up only 2 hits while striking out 15 North batters with 10 of the strikeouts coming in the second game. The south scored all of the runs it would need in the second inning as North starter Stacie Creel of Clinton surrendered four walks. Suzi Grubbs of Pascagoula delivered a three-run single to seal the North's fate.
- 2003** GAME 1: South 3, North 0; GAME 2: South 7, North 1 The South took a 1-0-1 series lead with a sweep of the North at Newton County High School in Decatur. East Central's Stephanie Comeaux threw a two-hit shutout and struck out an all star record 17 in the first game. Newton County's Lauren Barrett and Harrison Central's Shelley Lavender combined for a no-hitter in the second game as the South won easily. The North's only run for the day was an unearned tally scored in the fourth inning of the second game. The South wins marked the first sweep in the two year history of the series and the South also earned the series second straight shutout. Comeaux and East Central's Hayle Guess were named co-MVPs for the South. Starkville's Kayla Watkins was named the North MVP.
- 2004** GAME 1: South 1, North 0; GAME 2: South 5, North 0 Harrison Central's Brittany Ladner threw a no-hitter to lead the South to a 5-0 victory and a two-game sweep of the North. For her efforts, Ladner was named co-MVP along with Pascagoula's Courtney Davis, who went 2-for-3 in the second game and drove in two runs. Ladner struck our four North batters and allowed only two walks in the second contest as no North runner made it past first base. The South's Kelly Stokes of Lawrence County hurled a two-hit shutout in the first game as the South prevailed 1-0. Stokes struck out five and walked two in a complete game effort. The North managed only two hits for the day in the fast pitch contests. Southaven's Lacie McCulley was selected as the North MVP as she took the loss on the mound in the first game despite yielding only two hits. In game two, McCulley also pitched four plus innings of relief and gave up only one run. The South increased its series lead to 2-0-1 with the wins.
- 2005** GAME 1: South 2, North 0; GAME 2: North 3, South 0 at Mack Fanning Field, Newton County High School, Decatur, MS The North and South split a doubleheader in the fourth annual contest leaving the South in the series lead at 2-0-2. Nicole Chisolm of Clinton and Brittany Tillery of Starkville were named co-MVPs for the North while Petal's Jill Wedgeworth was chosen as the South MVP. Wedgeworth was 3-for-3 at the plate with 2 RBI in the opener as the South claimed a 2-0 victory. Wedgeworth's hits scored Union's Loren Kennedy and Natalie Shows of South Jones for the only runs scored in Game 1. East Central's Lauren Harger went the distance on the mound for the South as she scattered 6 hits to pick up the win. Southaven pitcher Nikki Dunn took the loss for the North. In the second game, the North tallied a pair of unearned runs in the 1st inning which paced the squad to a 3-0 blanking of the South. North starter Kady Chandler of Neshoba Central went the distance to earn the win after tossing a five-hit

shutout. Nicole Chisolm of Clinton, Sarah Huddleston of Ripley, and Cyndi Lott of Pearl all scored in the North victory. Lauren Anderson of Warren Central took the loss for the South.

2006 **CLASS 1A/2A/3A** *Game 1:* North 5, South 4; *Game 2:* North 3, South 1. The North swept the South 5-4 and 3-1 in two closely contested games to take the first series in the new format. In game one, the North came from behind with 2 runs to tie the game at 4-4 in the 6th inning and then tallied the winning run in the bottom of the 7th inning. Eupora's Edie Oliver, who was named the North MVP in the series, was the winning pitcher in game one as she tossed a complete game, yielding 6 hits, 4 runs with only 2 earned runs, and 6 strikeouts. Bogue Chitto's Meleah Brown took the loss for the South in a valiant effort as she tossed 6 and two thirds innings with 6 hits, 5 runs - 2 earned runs, 4 walks, and 5 strikeouts. In game two, the North had a razor thin 1-0 lead until they added 2 insurance runs in the 6th inning, and held off the South for the 3-1 victory. Winona's Katie Maddox was the winning pitcher for the North as she worked a complete game giving up 6 hits, the lone South run that came in the 6th inning, 1 walk, and four strikeouts. Kate Moreland of East Webster was the hard luck losing pitcher as she threw a complete game giving up only 2 hits and the 3 North runs (no earned runs) with 1 walk and 12 strikeouts. Moreland was named South MVP for her work on the mound and at the plate as she was 3-for-8 with one run scored and a double in game one.

2007 **CLASS 1A/2A/3A** *Game 1:* South 4, North 3; *Game 2:* South 10, North 2. The South toppled the North in a two game sweep on the strength of South MVP Megan Munn of Newton County, who was 4-for-7 at the plate, scored four runs, and added a double in game two. The South captured game one 4-3 in their last at-bat in the bottom of the 7th inning. Richland's Brandi Westerfield of the South was the winning pitcher while the hard luck pitcher was the North's Stephanie Pounders of Caledonia, who also took the loss in game two despite allowing only two earned runs in 6 1/3 innings of work on the day. Pounders made up for the losses at the plate where she was 3-for-7 with two runs scored and was named the North MVP. In game two, the South roared out to a 4-0 lead after two innings against Pounders including a two-run inside-the-park home run by Morton's Porsha Blackwell. North Pike's Catherine West earned the game two 10-2 win on the mound as she went the distance. North pitcher Cori Peters of Ackerman, who pitched the final 4 innings in relief of Pounders, was charged with an All-Star record 8 wild pitches which added to the South rout.

CLASS 4 Beshears, who normally played catcher but started in right field for the North, was 3-for-7 with 3 runs scored on the day. In game one, the North used a 4-run 6th inning to erase a South 3-1 lead. Sarah Gill of DeSoto Central was the winning pitcher for the North while the loss was charged to Long Beach's Susanna Teague. The North withstood a late rally by the South in game two after taking an early 4-0 lead. The South plated 3 runs in the 6th frame to make the contest interesting. Madison Central starting pitcher Lindsey Perry carried a perfect game for the North into the 5th inning when the South's Holly Lawrence of D'Iberville lined a single over the shortstop to lead off the inning. Perry finished with 11 strikeouts in the game. South starter Ashley Jones of Lawrence County was saddled with the loss as Susanna Teague pitched the last 3 innings for the South. Teague allowed only 2 earned runs in 10 innings pitched in the two game series. Pass Christian leftfielder Jennifer Jones was chosen as the South MVP as she went 4-for-7 with 3 runs scored and an RBI on the afternoon. Jones was 3-for-4 with two runs scored in game one for the South. **A/5A** *Game 1:* North 6, South 4; *Game 2:* North 4, South 3. The North edged the South 6-4 and 4-3 to take the 4A/5A series lead paced by North MVP Lorren Beshears of DeSoto Central.

2008 **CLASS 1A/2A/3A** *Game 1:* South 4, North 3; *Game 2:* South 5, North 3. The South took the overall 1A/2A/3A series lead by sweeping the North in two close contests. In game one, the South built a 4-0 lead and withstood a late 3-run rally in the 4th inning by the North for the one

-run victory. Morgan Whitlock of Union was the winning pitcher as she pitched 4 innings yielding only 4 hits and 3 runs with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts. Kossuth's Dani Woods absorbed the loss for the North as she gave up 4 runs on 4 hits with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts in 4 innings. Baleigh Volking of Enterprise provided the offense for the South on the day by going 3 for 7 with 3 runs scored including two doubles. Paige Holsen of Union also cracked a 3-run homer for the South in game one. In game two, the South broke a 3-3 tie with a 2-run 5th frame. Angelia Polk of Salem, who was named the South MVP, was the winning pitcher as she hurled 3 scoreless innings giving up only 1 hit with 1 strikeout. Polk had earlier picked up the save in game one by tossing 3 scoreless innings with 2 hits, 1 walk, and 2 strikeouts. CeCee Austin of South Pontotoc took the loss in game two as she went the distance and gave up 8 hits, all 5 South runs with 2 walks and 1 strikeout. Austin, however, was also named the North MVP for her efforts on the mound (6 2/3 innings, 5 runs, 2 walks, 1 strikeout on the day) and at the plate (1 for 7 with a double in game one).

CLASS 4A/5A *Game 1:* North 9, South 4; *Game 2:* North 11, South 0. The North captured their second straight 4A/5A series by powering to a 9-4, 11-0 sweep of the South. The arm and bat of South Panola's Whitney Kiihnl led the way for the North in game one as she pitched 7 innings, giving up 2 hits, no runs with 2 walks and 17 strikeouts. Kiihni was chosen as the North MVP as she was 5 for 7 on the day with 4 RBI and 4 runs scored including a game two double. She also tossed 2 innings in game two, yielding no runs, no hits, 2 walks, with two strikeouts. Megan Colvin of Stone County smacked a 3-run homer for the North as the North broke open a close 5-4 game with a 4-run bottom of the 6th to clinch the 9-4 win. Whitney Warner of Brandon was the losing pitcher with 5 innings of work on the hill, 3 hits, 5 runs, 2 walks, and 3 strikeouts. In game two, the North left no doubt with an 11-0 blanking. The North scored in every inning except for the 6th frame. Horn Lake's Allison Morgan picked up the win on the mound as she tossed 5 innings and gave up only 5 hits, no runs, 1 walk, with 5 strikeouts. Hancock's Mykeal Maes was named the South MVP as she was 2 for 6 on the day with a double in game one and a triple in game two. The South's Kayla Thompkins of East Central received the Morris Hunter Sportsmanship Award.

2009 **CLASS 1A/2A/3A** *Game 1:* North 6, South 3; *Game 2:* South 8, North 3. South MVP Lainie Simcox of SE Lauderdale went 4-for-6 in the two contests to help the South earn a split and maintain the series lead. (2-1-1) Simcox was 3-for-3 with a home run in the 6-3 loss in the opener and homered again in the 8-3 victory in the second game for the South. After Newton County's Kasie Buckley blanked the North over the first three innings in game one, the North greeted Morton's Taylor Hughes with back-to-back triples by Mooreville's Shelby Howell and North MVP Megan Timbs of Winona. Timbs later added a single and she went the distance on the mound with five strikeouts to pick up the win for the North. In the second game, the South broke a 2-2 tie with two runs in the top of the third inning. One run scored on a fielder's choice by Clarkdale's Jessica Clark and the other plated on a North error. Simcox then made it 5-2 for the South with a leadoff blast over the centerfield wall in the fifth inning. A three-run sixth sealed the South win as Haley Sones of Loyd Star led off with a homer to left field and Kasie Buckley delivered a two-run single. Winning pitcher Kaley Stampley of Columbia helped her cause with a pair of singles. Rebecca Rogers of Amory led the North with two singles but took the loss.

CLASS 4A/5A *Game 1:* South 7, North 3; *Game 2:* South 3, North 0. The South snapped the north's series winning streak behind the arms of D'Iberville's Kimi Wagner and East Central's Linsey Dickerson. The two highly-touted hurlers checked the North on 7 hits—all singles—in the 7-3, 3-0 sweep. Wagner scattered four singles in the opener as she struck out six and walked four. All three runs plated by the North in the 7-3 South win were unearned as a result of a first inning error. The North took the 3-0 lead on the bases-loaded throwing error by Petal shortstop

Nerissa Myers on a ground ball by Madison Central's Morgan Malone for the only runs the North would score in the series. The South took a 4-3 lead with two runs in the fourth on two North errors and then broke open the game in the fifth with three runs. South MVP Jackie Burri of East Central had an RBI triple in the first and a key RBI single in the fifth to pace the offense. Lindsey Morris of Madison Central absorbed the loss for the North in the first contest. In game two, neither team scored until the South got all three of its runs in the top of the sixth. Brianna Cherry of Petal led off with a single, stole second, and scored on a double by Jordan Adams of D'Iberville. Fielder's choices by Linsey Dickerson and Quitman's Krystyn Davis plated the 2nd and 3rd runs. Winning hurler Dickerson shut down the North as she went the distance yielding only 3 hits with 7 strikeouts and 2 walks. North MVP Erika Jons of Northwest Rankin had two of the North's Cleveland's Lauren Kendall was credited with the loss.

2010 CLASS 1A/2A/3A *Game 1:* South 6, North 0; *Game 2:* South 10, North 0. The South's pitching staff blanked the North to increase their series lead. In game one, Erin Adcock of Clarkdale and Aaron Harrington of Stringer combined for a five-hit shutout. South MVP Brooke Delaughter of Loyd Star threw a 1-hitter in game two to close out the series win. The North MVP was Nicki Whitten of Booneville who notched the only hit for her team in game two and threw out a runner on an attempted steal.

CLASS 4A/5A *Game 1:* South 5, North 1; *Game 2:* South 9, North 8. The South evened the series by defeating the North for the second straight year. In game one, Houston's Shelby Whitt put the North on top 1-0 in the first inning as she singled and scored on an RBI double by Londen Ladner of Northwest Rankin. The South took the lead for good at 3-1 in the fourth frame with an RBI double by Emily Todd of Clinton followed by an RBI single by Jasmine Shelby of Harrison Central. The South added two more runs on two errors in the sixth to clinch the win. In game two, the South held off the North's late rally for a narrow 9-8 win. Trailing 9-0 in the top of the seventh with one out, Shelby Whitt, Londen Ladner, and Southaven's Casey Badley scored on a bases-loaded triple by Pontotoc's Brooke Denton. North MVP Libby Goranson of DeSoto Central and Meggin Nelson of North Pontotoc each scored before the South could make the second out of the inning. The North added two more runs on a bases-loaded two-out single by Amory's Courtlyn McCollum before the South's Lauren Usry of Brandon came in to retire the final batter of the game for the win. E'Trereo Warren of Meridian hit an inside-the-park home run to pace the South's early offense and was named South MVP.

2011 CLASS 1A/2A/3A *Game 1:* South 5, North 4; *Game 2:* North 12, South 2. A close contest for the South and a romp for the North split the two games to help the South maintain the series lead at 3-1-2. In the opener, the North's Hayley Parker of Nettleton stunned the crowd as she hit the first home run to clear the fence in the 13-year history of Mack Fanning Stadium. Parker's first at-bat, first inning circuit clout went at least 10 feet beyond the 250-foot right field fence off Clarkdale's Alex Smith. The North then plated a second run for the early 2-0 lead. The South answered quickly in the bottom of the frame with 3 runs as Rebecca Dunn of Seminary singled and scored. Josie Porter of Bogue Chitto added another run and Enterprise-Lincoln's Chynna Coghlan hit an RBI single. In the sixth, the North retook the lead on two South errors and a two-run single by East Webster's Swayze Hollenhead. The South again responded in the bottom of the inning as they tied the game at 4-4 when Enterprise's Blair Hennington doubled, stole third, and scored on a sac fly RBI by Seminary's Rebecca Dunn. The winning run was scored by in the bottom of the 7th when Karley Crosby of Seminary singled, advanced to second on a wild pitch, and scored on a throwing error by losing hurler Swayze Hollenhead of East Webster on an attempted sacrifice bunt by Bethany Volking of Enterprise. Toy Smith of Bogue Chitto, the last of 3 pitchers used by the South, picked up the win. In the nightcap, the North roared out to a 7 run first inning lead and cruised to a 12-2 win to earn

the split. Four South errors contributed to the lead as the first eight North batters reached base. The North scored a run in the 2nd and three in the 4th highlighted by inside-the-park home runs by Corinth's Jakebia Keith and Nettleton's Hayley Parker, who was named the North MVP. For the day, MVP Parker was 3-for-4 with 2 home runs, 2 RBI, and 5 runs scored and she became the first All-Star in the fast or slow pitch categories to lead off a game with home run. Rebecca Dunn of Seminary, who was 2-for-4 at the plate with 1 RBI and 1 run scored, was selected as the South MVP.

CLASS 4A/5A/6A *Game 1:* North 11, South 1; *Game 2: cancelled due to inclement weather.* West Union starter Danielle Taylor gave up only two hits in four innings to earn the North victory. Heather Beesley of Stone County took the loss for the South. Morgan Fairley of George County was named the South MVP as she went 1-for-2 with an RBI double and she also received the Morris Hunter Sportsmanship Award. Heavy rains and hail forced officials to cancel game two of the series. Kossuth's Chassey Barnes, Mooreville's Lauren Lewis, East Webster's Swayze Hollenhead, and Wheeler's Jonie Green all had RBIs for the North squad. Amory's Ashley Camp had a single and triple while North Pontotoc's Brianna Gable added a sac fly RBI. Hamilton's Anna Imel had a pair of singles and an RBI. Smithville's Kami Roberts tripled and scored 2 runs. Audrey Hartman of Northwest Rankin was selected as the North MVP as she went 4-for-4, scored 3 runs, and had a key RBI double. Ashley Greenway of Southaven also went 4-for-4, scored 4 runs, and had one stolen base for the North. Winning pitcher Lacie Patterson of Southaven had a complete game giving up only 5 hits and she was also 3-for-4 from the plate with 3 RBI. The North's Taylor Holland of Grenada established all-star single records with 5 RBI and 2 sac flies.

2012 JUNIOR SERIES *Game 1:* North 1, South 0; *Game 2:* South 11, North 0. For the first time in All-Star Fast Pitch history, rising seniors were featured in a two-game series in 2012. In game one, the North scored an unearned run in the top of the first inning and held on for the 1-0 win over the South. North MVP Lauren Holifield of New Hope checked the South on 3 hits through 6 innings, walking only one and striking out 4 South batters. Lydia Dias of DeSoto Central took the circle in the 7th to pick up the save. The South's Rachel Hickman of Poplarville was the losing pitcher. The North's only run happened when Katie Anne Bailey of Madison Central tripled and scored on an errant outfield throw. The South exacted quick revenge in game two as they built up a 9-0 lead after 2 innings and cruised to an easy 11-0 shutout. The South jumped on started Lydia Dias who had picked up the North save in game one. South MVP Constance Quinn of Oak Grove was 3-for-4 with 3 RBI and made several acrobatic catches at shortstop. Hayleigh Harper of Enterprise Clarke was the winning pitcher for the South as she was allowed only 5 hits and struck out 6 in 4 innings of work.

SENIOR SERIES: Class 1A/2A/3A *Game 1:* North 15, South 13 (8 innings); *Game 2:* South 11, North 0. Game one of the 1A/2A/3A series was a classic as it was the first extra-inning game in MAC All-Star Fast Pitch history and established new single-game records for most combined runs (28), most combined hits (31), and longest game by time (2:26). The teams also tied the single-game record for most combined errors at 10. The North took an early 2-0 lead, but the South exploded for 6 runs in the bottom of the first paced by a 2-run single batted by Dana Arender of Raleigh. The North tallied 2 runs in the second and 3 in the third to take a 7-6 lead. Rachel Elder of East Union tied the game with a 2-run single and scored on an RBI single by Lesley Hudson of Hatley. The North extended the lead to 9-6 in the fourth as North MVP Makenzie Hawkins of Nettleton slammed a 2-run homer in the frame. The South tied the game in the fifth with 3 runs on a 2-run single by Lindsey Beard of Clarkdale and an RBI single by South MVP Lauren Little of Raleigh. The back-and-forth contest continued in the sixth as Kori Beth Leach of Nettleton put the North ahead 10-9 with an RBI double. The South retook the lead in

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the bottom of the inning as Dana Arender added an RBI single and Union's Haley Stephens scored from third on a passed ball. The North struck back in the top of the seventh as Taylor Seiler of Calhoun City led off the inning with a home run to forge an 11-11 tie. Lexie Boykin of Enterprise scored on an error to provide the North with a 12-11 lead. The South tied the game in the bottom of the seventh and had the potential winning run thrown out at home plate to send the game into extra innings. Lindsey Beard plated Hayley Fox of Enterprise-Clarke for the tie run. Kierra Collins of Franklin County, who set an All-Star single game record with 5 stolen bases, was the thrown out trying to score on a wild pitch. The North surged back ahead 15-12 in the top of the eighth on a Boykin RBI single and run-scoring ground balls by Kori Beth Leach and Victoria White of Mooreville. The South could only plate on a run in the bottom of the eighth as Kierra Collins scored on a wild pitch. Lesley Hudson of Hatley was the winning pitcher as she pitched the last three innings. Abby Roberts of Clarkdale took the loss in relief. Five pitchers in the South were in the circle from the second through seventh innings. In game two, the South left no doubt as she blanked the North 11-0. The South eased into an early 2-0 lead in the first inning and put the game away with a 4-run fourth and 3-run fifth. Lauren Little of Raleigh paced the South in the second contest as she was 3-for-3 at the plate and drove in 4 runs. Dana Arender, also of Raleigh.

SENIOR SERIES: Class 4A/5A/6A *Game 1:* North 6, South 3; *Game 2:* South 7, North 4. The North took game one by a 6-3 score after breaking open a 1-1 battle in the second inning with 4 runs plated. Kaylin Hopkins of Louisville drew a bases-loaded walk, Corey Hollis of Lafayette scored on a wild pitch, and Lake Cormorant's Alex Barrett hit a 2-run single to complete the North scoring. Hallie Frenn of Saltillo pitched the first four innings for the North to earn the win. Lindsey Shaw of Senatobia picked up a save in relief while Megham Maddox of Bay High took the loss for the South. In game two, the South jumped on the North quickly with a pair of 3-run innings to lead 6-0 after three frames. South MVP Dani Craft of D'Iberville hit an RBI double and Michelle Stringer of Bay High smacked a 2-run double to give the South the early 3-9 lead in the first inning. With Amber McBroom of Brandon at first base and one out in the third, Craft hit an infield single and both players scored on an errant throw. Stringer then blasted a solo home run to put the South ahead 6-0. The South added another run in the top of the seventh and the North rallied with 4 runs in the bottom of the inning as Alex Barrett of Lake Cormorant came home on an error and her twin sister Andi Barrett picked up an RBI on a ground out. Kory Watterson of DeSoto Central followed with a 2-run homer to cut the South lead to 7-4 but the South hung on for the win. Brandon's Amber McBroom was the starting and winning pitcher for the South while Lindsey Shaw of Senatobia took the loss for the North. When Corey Hollis of Lafayette popped out to Brittany Lang of Biloxi to end the game, the final MAC Fast Pitch All-Star game played by graduating seniors was concluded. Christa Brown of South Panola was selected as the North MVP as she was 4-for-7 at the plate in the series, scored 4 runs, and had a stolen base. The North's Kaitlin Moore of DeSoto Central received the Morris Hunter Sportsmanship

2013 **CLASS 1A/2A/3A:** *Game 1:* North 9, South 7; *Game 2:* Cancelled due to rain. The North defeated the South 9-7 to win the 2013 series as rain washed out Game Two early in the contest. With the single game win, the North sliced the South's series lead to 3-2-3. Allie Steadman of Eupora was named the MVP for slugging a key home run in the North victory. Emmalee Roberts of Enterprise-Clarke, was recognized for the most ad sales.
